### BOARD NOTES

Board Chair Rob Shellhamer stopped his combine in the field to join the Finance Committee by phone. Rob missed the board meeting as he was harvesting late in the night. Charlie Guthrie presided over the board meeting. The details of the discussion at the board meeting revolved around donuts, dishtowels, dishwashers and dollars. For more information about details from the ministry teams see a board member. As always all church members are welcome at the board meetings.

The recommendation of the nominating committee's list of leadership positions for the New Year was approved. The Bethany Fellows program was reviewed and the board decided to move \$10,000 from the Scrip Program and use this over the next four years to send Rev. Haley to this training and support program. The church's 2019 budget was approved. Both the 2019 budget and leadership nominees were slated to go before the church membership at the Congregational Meeting on December 16th. The Finance Committee recommended that \$25,000 be moved from checking to savings to be held in the Rainy-Day Fund. The goal is to be able to financially sustain the church for one year. The Outreach Committee recommended that we make a one-time donation to Week of Compassion out of end of year reserves of \$1,500.

A discussion regarding WCC by-laws on terms for trustees, elders, and deacons resulted in recommendation that the by-laws be reviewed and perhaps restructured to reflect our smaller congregation. This effort should begin in January. The next WCC board meeting is scheduled for January 9, 2019.

We will be collecting monetary donations as well as children's clothing and children's flip flops during the month of January to send with Tobi. Clothing and flip flops can be deposited in a designated box in the East Fellowship Hall any time after January 9th. Monetary donations will be taken Sunday, January 13 and Sunday, January 20, 2019.

## MINISTRY NOTES

### Outreach Ministry

The January Moment for Mission is the Minister's Benevolent Fund. The dictionary defines benevolent as a kindly, charitable activity or an inclination to do good. Benevolence takes on additional meaning and becomes a God thing when used at church.

The mission statement for WCC is: "Committed to spreading the Good News of the love of Christ, through service to all." This statement implies that actions and service are involved with sharing the love of Christ. The Benevolent Fund is a tool used by the minister to share the love of Christ.

What do we do when someone who is hungry or has other basic needs knocks on the church door? Often we refer them to F.I.S.H. or Helping Hands or some other service provider. But sometimes it is more of a calling for the minister to share her faith while giving hope and assistance to those in need. When someone comes knocking at the door, what should the minister do?

In the 21st chapter of the book of John, Jesus is heard saying:

"Take care of my sheep" "Feed my sheep"

We all know the story of how Jesus feed the 5,000.

Steve Sjogren in his book *Conspiracy of Kindness* talks about deeds of love. "God's love must be communicated from person to person, not just from page to person. If His love could be sent through printed information alone, we could simply flood our cities with gospel tracts and then rest assured that we have done our part. Deeds of love allow us to sneak into the hearts of those we serve. Even though people aren't conscious of what's happening, they are welcoming us and the God we represent into the fortress of their hearts. Deeds of love aren't enough on their own to bring someone to Christ, but they do create "phone wires" for transmitting the spoken message."

The Benevolent Fund is used by the minister to bring hope and kindness to people seeking help. The good deeds show that we **ARE** "Committed to spreading the Good News of the love of Christ, through service to all."

As you pray about how much of a gift to make to the Benevolent Fund you should ask, What would Jesus do?
